



Camping in New England High Country

Oxley Wild Rivers National Park

Apsley Falls Campground – via Oxley Highway, 20 km east of Walcha

Apsley Falls campground offers bush camping with scenic waterfall views, bushwalking and wildlife.	
Number of campsites:	14
Camping type:	Tent, Camper trailer site, Caravan site, Camping beside my vehicle.
Facilities:	Picnic tables, barbecue facilities, carpark, toilets.
Please note:	All sealed access - suitable for large caravans. Sites are marked.

Budds Mare Campground – Moona Plains Road, 44 km east of Walcha

With scenic views of Apsley River Gorge, it's a great weekend getaway for bushwalking and relaxing.	
Number of campsites:	3
Camping type:	Tent, Camper trailer site, Camping beside my vehicle.
Facilities:	Picnic tables, barbecue facilities, toilets.
Please note:	Sites are not marked. Bring own water.

Riverside Campground – Moona Plains Road, 44 km east of Walcha (low range 4WD only)

Go wilderness camping or swim, fish and paddle on the Apsley River.	
Number of campsites:	13
Camping type:	Tent.
Facilities:	Picnic tables, barbecue facilities, toilets.
Please note:	For campers: Check in after 10.30am. Check out by 10am. Access code required. Day use visitors: Vehicle permits are valid from 7am to 7pm and must be paid online.

Tia Falls Campground – via Oxley Highway, 39 km east of Walcha

Great for a weekend trip, it's near bushwalking tracks and scenic views of waterfalls and gorges.	
Number of campsites:	6
Camping type:	Tent, Camper trailer site, Caravan site, Camping beside my vehicle.
Facilities:	Picnic tables, barbecue facilities, toilets.
Please note:	Sites are marked. Bring own water.

Youdales Hut Campground – via Oxley Highway, 90 km east of Walcha (low range 4WD only)

A wilderness getaway surrounded by gorge country for hardy adventure seekers.	
Number of campsites:	3
Camping type:	Tent, Camping beside my vehicle.
Facilities:	Picnic tables, barbecue facilities, toilets
Please note:	Sites are marked. For campers: Check in 2pm, check out 10am. Access code required. Day use visitors: Vehicle permits are valid from 7am to 7pm and must be paid online. Bring own water and firewood.



Carrai National Park

Daisy Plains – via Oxley Highway, 145 km north-east of Walcha (4WD access only)

These bush huts offer toilets and a kitchen area and are perfect for remote camping.	
Number of campsites:	5 rooms.
Camping type:	Bunkhouse.
Facilities:	Kitchen with open fireplace, picnic tables, toilet.
Please note:	Huts are often used by NPWS staff doing maintenance work. Please take your garbage with you. Bring own firewood.

Mummel Gulf National Park

New Country Swamp Campground – Mummel Forest Road, 71 km south-east of Walcha

A basic site within walking distance of rugged Mummel Gulf, offering scenic views, and birdwatching.	
Number of campsites:	5
Camping type:	Tent, Camper trailer site, Camping beside my vehicle.
Facilities:	Picnic tables, barbecue facilities, toilets.
Please note:	Sites are unmarked. Noise restrictions apply at this campground. Bring own water.

Nowendoc National Park

Jacky Barkers Campground – via Thunderbolts Way, 71 km south-east of Walcha (4WD access only)

Combine 4WD camping and Aboriginal heritage with birdwatching, swimming, bushwalking and mountain biking.	
Number of campsites:	5
Camping type:	Tent, Camper trailer site, Camping beside my vehicle.
Facilities:	Picnic tables, barbecue facilities, carpark, toilets
Please note:	Sites are marked. Bring own water and firewood. Wrights Hut can be inspected but is not to be used by campers or picnickers.

Werrikimbe National Park

Mooraback Campground – Mooraback Road, 88 km south-east of Walcha

Explore nearby walking tracks and enjoy the tranquillity of this isolated spot.	
Number of campsites:	5
Camping type:	Tent, Camper trailer site, Camping beside my vehicle.
Facilities:	Picnic tables, barbecue facilities, toilets
Please note:	Sites are marked. Noise restrictions apply at this campground. Bring own firewood.
